THE HI-TECH-AS-HARLEY-STREET GADGETS

Medi-spas are so last year. Right now, anti-ageing gadgets that you can use while you're watching TV are red-hot – and about to lose their their gimmicky reputation thanks to some serious results...

THE LINE-ZAPPING HAND-HELD

This year's most anticipated anti-ageing gizmo launches in Selfridges next month. 'Stop' (1) uses can't-feel-a-thing radio-frequency technology (aka TriPollar) to turn back the clock and help reverse the signs of ageing. Skin appears smoother and more radiant almost straightaway, but twice-weekly 15-minute sessions see radical results within a month. Stop costs £396 (www.stop-age.com).

THE FACE-LIFTING HEADBAND

Safetox (2) might make you look like a Dr Who villain, but according to Selfridges customers (where it sold out a week after its launch), the results are well worth it. A daily five-minute fix gives enough time for electrical impulses to relax the wrinklecausing muscles on your face so you see a crease-free complexion within weeks. THE ANTI-WRINKLE LIGHTSABER

Light therapies have successfully treated complexion concerns in salons for years (blue bulbs blast away acne-causing bacteria), while red light targets wrinkles by stimulating collagen.
